Particularly, the course examines different forms of marriages and their legal implications on the spousal relationship; parent and child relationship; marital assets; different types of family structures in the indigenous society and other miscellaneous legal aspects. In wills, the course will examine benefactors and beneficiaries in wills; different types of wills; Preferred and Substitute Beneficiaries and Beneficiaries' Portions; gift and testamentary gift (hibah wasiat); as well as the development and recent changes in the law of marriage, family and wills - according to Indonesian Adat law.
5	Law	Bachelor	LWPE600012	The Obligation and Special Agreement	3	Odd Semester	This course discusses a wide range of issues on Contract and Specific Transactions in Contract, such as the structure and classification of Chapter III of the Indonesian Civil Code, definition of contract, sources and types of contracts, performance and non-performance of contract, force majeure, remedies, Torts and termination of contracts. In addition, this course also covers Special Agreements - both governed by the Civil Code and other relevant laws - which include transactions such as sales, barter, leases, grants, bailment, right to use, loans, granting of power and assumption.

Further, the course will examine basis of authority (e.g. ascription, delegation and mandate); limitation of power (doelmatigheid, rechtsmatigheid, wetmatigheid, AUPB and Good Governance); discretion, governmental actions and product of its actions. It will also touch on the issues such as governmental agencies; government tools such as acts/laws and beleidsregel; people's rights to be protected, preventive, repressive, Administrative Court; human resources aspect of government; national and local budgeting system (APBN and APBD); state asset and local government asset; sources and management of state funding; tax as state's income; and, lastly, monitoring and administrative sanctions. The course begins with discussion on environmental law principles such as sustainable development, polluter pays principles, precautionary principles, prevention principles, state responsibility and environmental justice. Furthermore, the course discusses the organizational aspect of environment, both in national and local levels, their authorities, responsibilities, roles in environmental planning and conducting strategic environmental assessment. The discussion will be followed by examination of planning instruments such as command and control approach, economic and voluntary approach. Moreover, entitlement and claim, including claim settlements, both in court and other venues, will also be examined in relation to the enforcement of the three legal areas involved (i.e. criminal, civil and administrative laws). Lastly, the course analyzes actual cases derived from environmental law - using theories, practices and decisions - and studies the application of the said three legal sets of laws.</p>

Other types of unincorporated associations or entities are also discussed. At the end of this course, the students will have an understanding of the law applicable to a number of modern business organizations, the significance of these business organizations in the creation of wealth and the laws applied to the personnel involved in the management of such organizations.
11	Law	Bachelor	LWHD600034	The Philosophy of Law	2	Odd Semester	This course presents the basic principles of Philosophy of Law, purpose of law and philosophical views. The course emphasizes on several topics such as introduction to philosophy, issues and methods, analytical approach, steps in understanding philosophy as well as understanding jurisprudence (i.e. the study of law and legal system). In addition, the course also studies the difference between law and other empirical subjects, philosophy of law, and normative characteristics of law. Further, the course will also look into philosophical doctrines such as doctrine of fate, legal positivism, Kelsenian doctrine, sociology of law, realism, history of law, court system, and Pancasila as harmonization pillars of legal norms.

The documents have special legal status that enables them to flow freely through commercial networks. Negotiable instruments can be used for both credit and payment purposes. For example, a promissory note evidencing a promise to repay money owed is a credit instrument. A check written to pay dues is a payment instrument. The main legal bases of these Commercial Papers are the Indonesian Commercial Code and several laws related to certain types of commercial paper issued by the Bank of Indonesia (Indonesia Central Bank).

The Law of the Sea covers not only the use of water surfaces, but also sea waterways, the bottom floor of the sea and the ground underneath. Several important developments in the Law of the Sea - starting from the era prior to the codification of law, to the Geneva Convention in 1958, and the Law of the Sea Convention in 1982 - would also be examined. In addition, the course also discusses issues such as maritime zone, rights and obligations of coastal nations and foreign vessels, various jurisdictions applied in the seas and settlement of disputes arising from the use of the sea, and, lastly, the application of the Law of the Sea by a number of countries including Indonesia.
